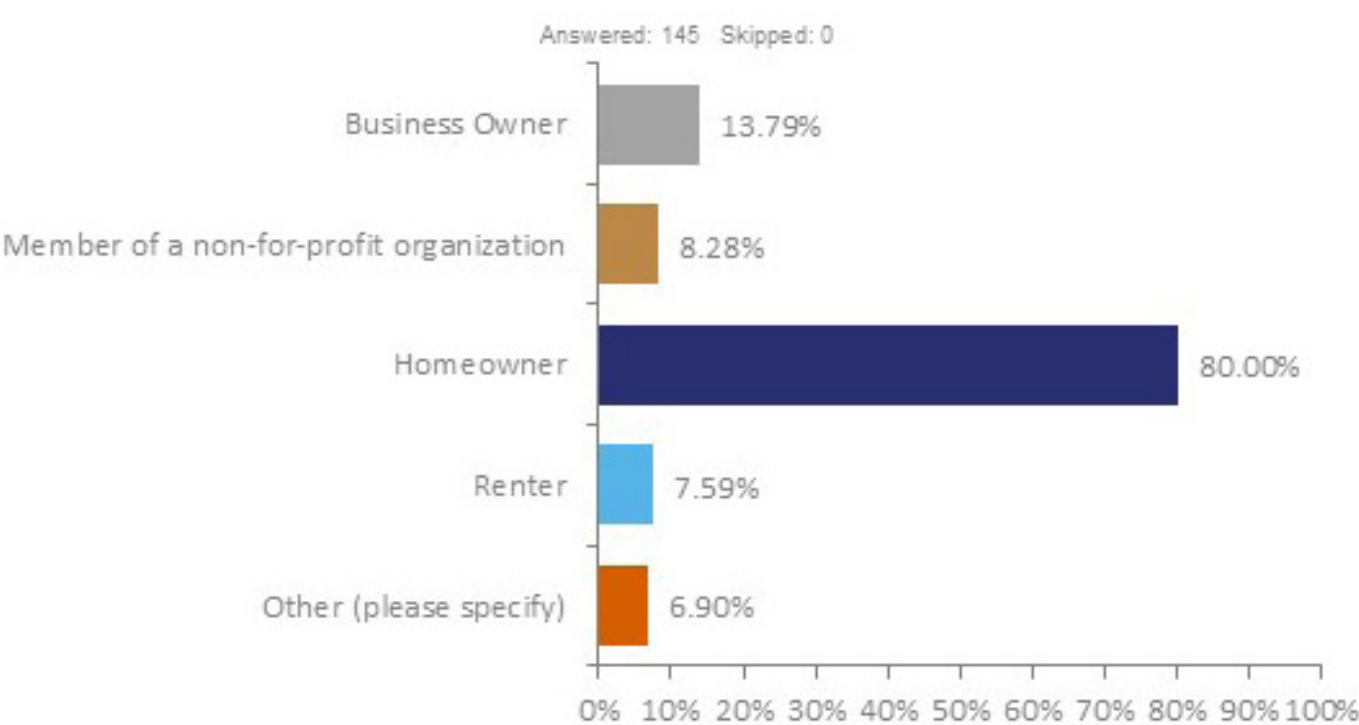

## Key Takeaways

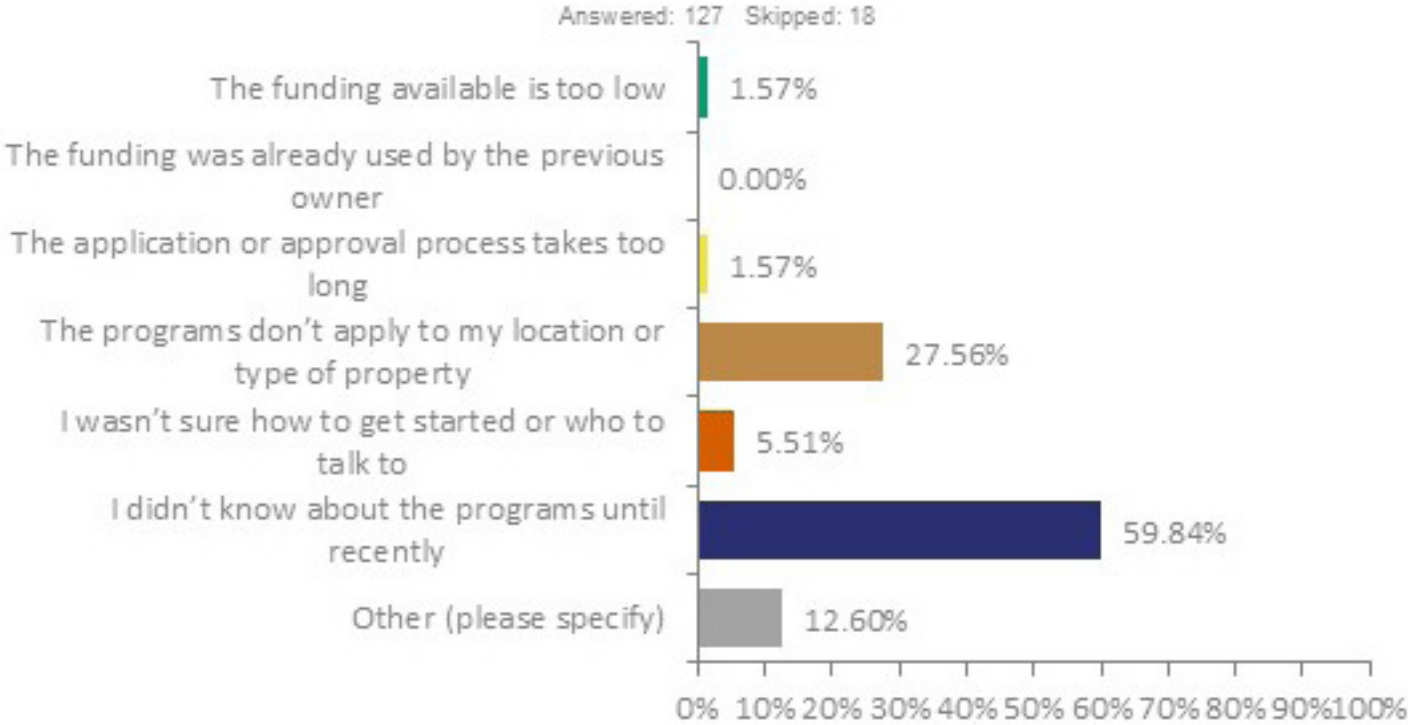
Survey results indicated that 95% of respondents had never used a program. Primary reasons for lack of use were that respondents (almost 60%) were unaware of the programs, while 27% indicated that the programs were not available in their geographical location. Overall respondents indicated that the programs would benefit from stronger promotion to raise awareness about the programs available as well as expanding the boundaries for the programs.

74% of respondents indicated support for programs for affordable and attainable housing and highlighted the need for housing options for young people and seniors. Funding for the creation of Additional Residential Units were also highlighted as a area for consideration.

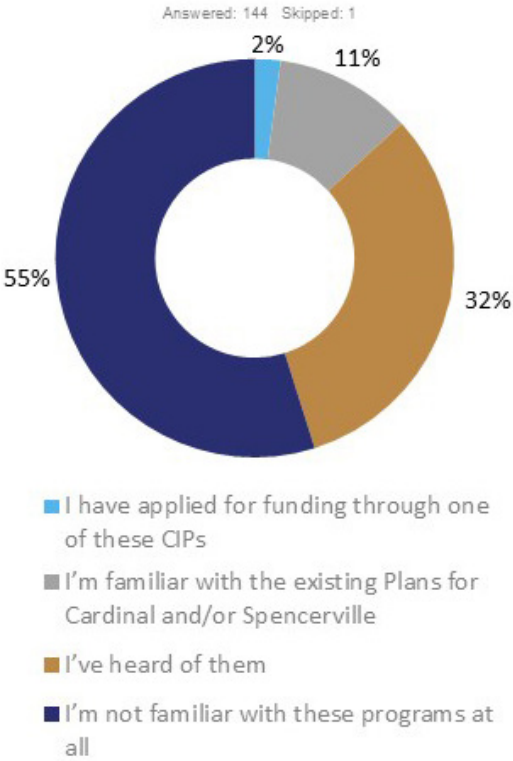
Which of the following best describes you? (Select all that apply)



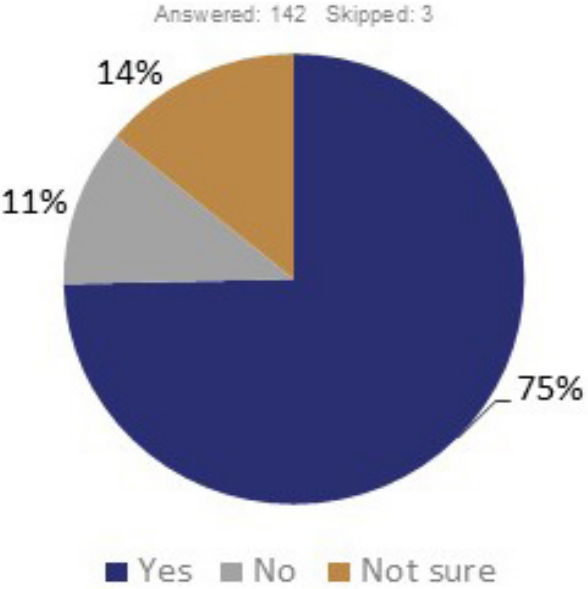
If you have not used any CIP programs, what are the main reasons you have not applied?



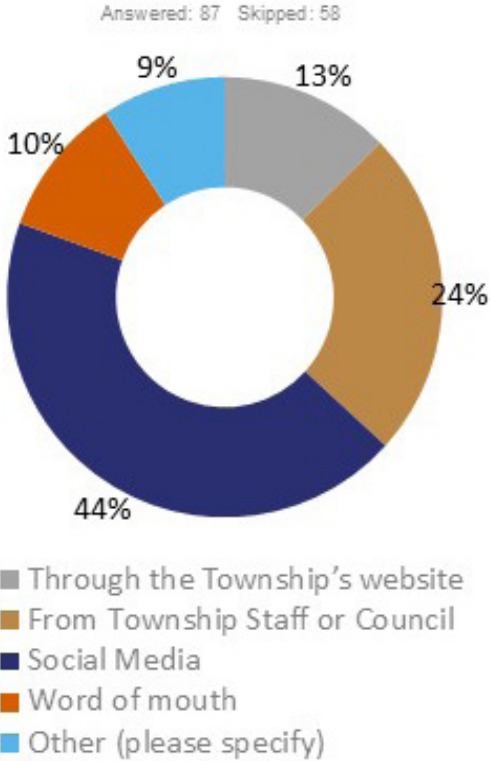
How familiar are you with the Township's current Community Improvement Plans (CIPs) for Cardinal and Spencerville?



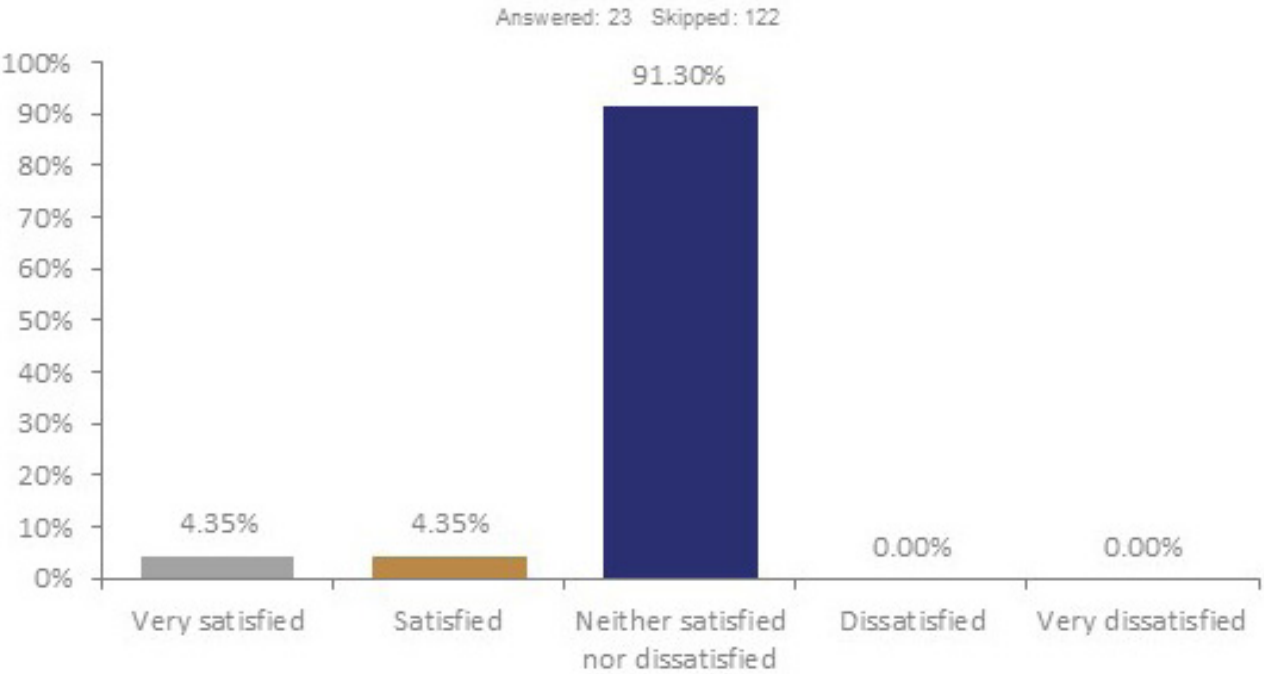
