JOHNSTOWN JEWELS RECOGNIZED FOR BIG WIN



The Johnstown Jewels U15 Girls Softball Team shocked the province with a perfect six-game run to capture the 2025 OSSTA Provincial Championship in Milton. Formed just two seasons ago by five parents, the team held open tryouts at the old Leo Boivin rink, practiced through winter and spring, and rose to the challenge with 12 players aged 13–15. Along the way, they defeated top-ranked North Bay, edged Whitby, and won the final 8–3 over Stouffville.

On September 8, Mayor Tory Deschamps and TWPEC Council honoured the Jewels

at the Townhall in Spencerville, proclaiming August 24, 2026, as “Johnstown Jewels Day.” MPP Steve Clark and MP Michael Barrett also extended recognition.

“We celebrate not only a championship win but also teamwork, perseverance, and community pride,” said Mayor Deschamps.

Guests joined the celebration, recognizing the athletes, coaches, and families whose dedication made this provincial victory possible.

BRUSH AND LEAF COLLECTION IN NOVEMBER

TWPEC will provide fall brush and leaf collection in built-up areas of Spencerville, Cardinal, New Wexford and Johnstown, with free drop-off at the Scott Road Transfer Station. Service runs only if winter conditions hold off.

Curbside collection is Tuesday, November 4 in Cardinal, and Wednesday, November 5 in Johnstown, Spencerville and New Wexford. Place materials at the curb by 7:30 a.m.

The Scott Road Transfer Station will accept brush and leaves on Wednesday, November 12 from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., with fees waived. Brush drop-off fees are also waived during regular hours throughout November.

Guidelines: branches under 1.2 metres long and 75 mm in diameter, secured bundles under 18 kg, and leaves in clear plastic or paper composting bags. Roots, construction waste or garbage will not be collected.
