

**THE CORPORATION OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF EDWARDSBURGH/CARDINAL**

BY-LAW NO. 2017- 38

**"TO APPOINT A REPRESENTATIVE TO THE ST. LAWRENCE CORRIDOR
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION."**

WHEREAS Section 11 of the Municipal Act 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, in part provides that a lower-tier municipality may pass by-laws respecting the economic well-being of the municipality;

AND WHEREAS the Township of Edwardsburgh/Cardinal entered into a joint agreement with The Corporation of the Town of Prescott, The Corporation of the City of Brockville, The Corporation of the Township of Augusta, The Corporation of the Township of Elizabethtown-Kitley, The Corporation of the Township of Leeds and the Thousand Islands, and the Corporation of the Township of Front of Yonge in respect to the creation of the St. Lawrence Corridor Economic Development Commission on May 23, 2017;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to appoint a representative to the Board of Directors of the St. Lawrence Corridor Economic Development Commission;


NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Edwardsburgh/Cardinal enacts as follows:

1. That Brendan Bland is hereby appointed as the industrial/business representative of the Township of Edwardsburgh/Cardinal for the St. Lawrence Corridor Economic Development Commission Board of Directors.
2. That the appointment is for the term July 24, 2017 to July 24, 2020, with the possibility of an extension for a further 3 years.
3. That this by-law shall come into force and effect on the date of passing.


Read a first and second time this 24th day of July, 2017.
