


# YOUR 2026 INTERIM TAX NOTICE

Council approved the 2026 Budget with a 3% increase to the Township portion of property taxes. This results in an overall property tax increase of approximately 2.5% when County and Education portions are included.

## WHERE DO MY PROPERTY TAXES GO?

Your property tax dollar is shared between municipal, county, and education services. The Township collects all property taxes and distributes the County and Education portions on their behalf.

## HOW TO PAY YOUR PROPERTY TAXES

Your 2026 Interim Tax Bill payment is due by March 31, 2026. Interest accrues after the due date at 1.25% per month.

## BUILDING PERMIT REVIEW

Our Building Department will be reviewing open building permits from previous years to finalize and close outstanding files.

Permits remain open until construction meets Ontario Building Code requirements and all required inspections are completed. Permits stay with the property and become the responsibility of new owners if ownership changes. Permits that must remain open for compliance may be subject to renewal fees and review by building officials.
